WALLPAPERS

WALLPAPERS is a collaborative project founded in 2011 by artists Sara Ludy, Nicolas Sassoon and Sylvain Sailly. Since its creation, the project has existed under two specific contexts; exhibited online at w-a-l-l-p-a-p-e-r-s.net and manifesting in space through international exhibitions and events. WALLPAPERS online takes form as a catalogue of digital patterns created by each artist. Each digital pattern (or wallpaper) from the catalogue is displayed full-screen on its own URL. On a regular basis, new wallpapers are added to the catalogue, including occasional contributions from invited artists. WALLPAPERS offline takes form as site-specific installations comprised primarily of large-scale video-projections. These site-specific installations employ digital patterns from the online catalogue and project them in space at a larger scale, producing environments adjusted to the proportions of the architecture in context.

WALLPAPERS refers to both traditional wallpaper applied to walls as well as digital wallpaper applied to computer desktop backgrounds. By extension, the project also refers to the practice of pattern-making for the creation of traditional and digital wallpapers. At large, WALLPAPERS refers to a wide range of imageries and formats, equally drawn from the history of computer graphics as from the artist's ongoing inquiries. Each participating artist is engaged in a significant production of digital patterns; conveying their own approach to the format and employing distinctive modes of production. WALLPAPERS as a collaborative project embodies the multiplicity of these approaches by displaying an array of artistic inquiries on the wallpaper format in the digital age. The artworks exhibited through WALLPAPERS hold ties to traditional methods of pattern-making, while also being art forms adjusted to a contemporary technological context of art production and dissemination. WALLPAPERS was founded by artists sharing similar relationships with digital technology: individuals who are deeply involved with contemporary image-making tools and culture while developing artistic investigations focused on the production of motion-based, screen-based and projection-based digital artworks. In that regard, WALLPAPERS emphasizes the use of screens and projections as displays for digital art forms. WALLPAPERS relates to the viewership; more specifically the viewer's experience of digital content through technological and mediated means. Each digital pattern is created with the ambition to become a motif with a specific duration - to be looked at and experienced through time. Through its online publication of patterns, WALLPAPERS makes use of the ordinary computer/laptop screen as a display for digital works and a site for a specific aesthetic experience. Through its exhibition of the same patterns within physical spaces, WALLPAPERS makes use of projections and screens as key constituents in the formulation of site-specific environments.

During the creation process of each WALLPAPERS pattern, principles and techniques relating to decorative arts, graphic design, industrial design and fashion design are taken into account. Each artist engages with these fields while conveying their own artistic inquiries. The digital patterns exhibited through WALLPAPERS intend to address these fields of Applied Arts while offering a distinctive experience in terms of content and environment. This aspect is also emphasized through installation by projecting digital patterns to the scale of architecture. During this process, techniques relating to interior design, trade show design and architectural planning are taken into consideration. By acknowledging and bearing in mind current industry standards from various fields of Applied Arts, the artworks and installations produced through WALLPAPERS aim to reflect on the notion of digital content becoming a relevant part of today's constructed environments.

Sassoon's work makes use of various computer-based processes to generate fantasized visions of architectures, landscapes and domestic environments. While most of his work is published online as animated GIFs, Sassoon also materializes his screen-based practice into sculptures, prints, textiles, and site-specific installations, as well as collaborations with other artists, architects, music producers and fashion designers. Sassoon's work often explores the contemplative dimensions of the digital, as well as the manner in which virtual space can (or cannot) be inscribed within the physical realm. Nicolas Sassoon has previously exhibited his work at the Victoria & Albert Museum (UK), Today Art Museum(CN), New Museum(US), 319 Scholes(US), Eyebeam(US), May Gallery & Residency(US), Contemporary Art Gallery(CA), Charles H.Scott Gallery(CA), Western Front(CA), PRETEEN Gallery(MX), the Centre d'Art Bastille(FR), Arti et Amicitiae(NL), MU Eindhoven(NL), the Berlin Fashion Week (DE)) and the New-York Fashion Week (US).
